Two Public Protests Set For Sunday

Two mass meetings are schediled for Sunday afternoon to protest police brutality in New York City, and the alleged illegal agreement made by police and the Department of Justice to protect brutal cops from FBI scrutiny.

The meetings are both called for 3:30 P. M. One is sponsored by the New York branch of the NAACP, whose complaint to Federal authorities in the Jacob Jackson case brought the police-Department-of-Justice deal to light. The other is sponsored by Congressman Adam Clayton Powell, Jr., who is responsible for the current Congressional investigation of the scandal.

While many citizens expressed the wish that the meetings could have been combined, it was also pointed out that in a community of more than 500,000 there is plenty of room for two meetings—and even more.

The NAACP meeting will be held at Friendship Baptist Church, 144 W. 131st St. Jacob Jackson will describe how police of the W. 54th St. precinct allegedly beat him and his friend Samuel Crawford brutally last summer, while the two were handcuffed in the stationhouse.
